

2021 ANNUAL REPORT







Elevate Youth California is a statewide program supporting community leaders who are addressing substance use disorder by investing in the leadership development and activism of youth of color and LGBTQ2S+ youth ages 12 to 26.

ACCOMPLISHMENT HIGHLIGHTS



NAMI San Diego was awarded a Naloxone Standing Order, in partnership with the San Diego County Department of Education, to provide at least two Narcan kits at every middle school and high school in the county. NAMI San Diego has distributed 27 Narcan kits and trained 90 school staff.

One youth participant from Fresh Lifelines for Youth, Inc. engaged in the Youth Advisory Board of the City of Oakland's Reimagining Public Safety Task Force to develop a survey to get input from youth on recommendations for improving public safety in Oakland. The city approved a budget with several recommendations provided by 398 youth through the survey, including diverting \$18.5 million in funding from the Oakland Police Department to policing alternatives.

Pinoleville Pomo Nation successfully advocated for and implemented a Northern Pomo Language Class at Ukiah High School to engage youth in learning their language, promote healing and offer a sense of belonging. Forty Native American students are enrolled in the class.

Seven youth organizing interns from the RYSE Center, in collaboration with Healthy Richmond and the Schools and Neighborhood Action Team, provided recommendations that were included in the West Contra Costa Unified School District's 2021-2024 Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). These included providing more support for school staff, students and families; providing equitable engagement with students and parents and mental health services and resources.

CommuniCare Health Centers provided technical assistance to nine schools to establish their Gender and Sexuality Alliances to unite LGBTQ2S+ and allied youth to promote acceptance and get students involved in their campus climate and advocacy.


DISTRIBUTION OF NEW STAKEHOLDERS ENGAGED BY SECTOR (N=631*)








% OF YOUTH ENGAGED BY RACE OR ETHNIC GROUP (N=11,514**)
