





The Public Health Triangle


The Public Health Triangle is a model that details the connections that influence health compromising or promoting behaviors.

Individual Prevention:

• focuses on changing the host.

Environmental Prevention (EP):

• focuses on changing the agent and environment.



PREVENTION:

Stopping a health compromising behavior before it happens.

EP focuses on factors in our physical, social and political environment that influences behavior.

It recognizes that decisions about "healthy" and "unhealthy" behavior is not just a matter of education and personal choice.

Environmental Prevention strategies focus on:

• Social & Cultural

Norms

- Media Messages
- Laws & Policies
- Access & Availability





Social & Cultural Norms

What is considered expected and typical behavior in families, neighborhoods, schools, and communities.

Media Messages

Central to shaping attitudes, norms, attitudes and and beliefs about acceptable & unacceptable behavior.


Laws & Policies

Determined and enforced by families, law enforcement, schools, businesses, city councils, etc.

Access & Availability

The degree to which the product is accessible to as many people as possible.

- How easy is it to get?
- Where is it sold?
- What is the cost?
- Who is making it available?





Why Environmental Prevention?

Rather than address public health issues by targeting individuals, EP targets those community practices, attitudes and values that encourage unhealthy or unsafe behavior.

It succeeds by promoting long-term, systemic change that promote healthy behaviors and attitudes, and reduce high-risk behaviors.





Why Environmental Prevention?

EP is not only effective for substance use prevention. EP strategies can be applied to any social issue - transportation, housing, immigration, racism, etc.

Whatever your issue area, we encourage you to utilize EP, the public health triangle, and the social determinants of health as frameworks to help explain and frame inequities. This gives you the ability to create environmental solutions that will eventually lead to individual changes.



That's soooo EP Game

A main hangout in town is a pizza parlor filled with alcohol advertisements. Youth in town organized and created the Extreme Community Makeover. Paint and repair hardware were donated and the youth removed over 150 alcohol advertisements and cleaned up the restaurant, creating a more family-friendly environment.



Youth have conducted observational assessments to determine whether local corner stores are in compliance with Lee Law.

Youth find that more than half of the store window signage exceeds the 33% allowed by the state. Your group is advocating for a local ordinance and enforcement of this law.

A teacher spends a month on nutrition and physical fitness in health class and the students learn a lot and have to do a food log to identify what and how much they're eating.



A Friday Night Live youth chapter makes posters telling youth not to drink because bad things will happen. They also organize an event on a Friday because they want youth to have fun things to do going into the weekend.



Youth in Redwood City are upset that they are being taught common core curriculum but aren't being taught about A-G requirements, which are necessary to complete in order to get into universities. Youth educate other youth first with an awareness poster campaign and then get the district to put into policy that a mandatory meeting occurs, in multiple languages, at the beginning of each year as well as halfway through the year. Along with this meeting, letters and phone calls are also required to go out to all parents and guardians.



Youth worked in collaboration with a school district to pass a policy that stated school sponsored events could not sell alcohol or have alcohol on the premises. This created an alcohol-free environment sponsored by the administration.



Youth worked with a local community center to establish a policy to add healthy snacks to the vending machine. At the same time, these youth worked with other youth who attended the community center to identify what snacks they would like and find appealing.



Schools realize that youth of color, especially black and Latin@ students, aren't applying to colleges at the same rate that white youth are. The school partners with a local community agency implement a free after school tutoring session for any youth that want it.
